#### NIHR Senior Investigators Award - Now open!

Deadline: 25 August 2021

NIHR Senior Investigators will receive a 4 year award on the recommendation of an Independent Selection Committee. NIHR Senior Investigator awards are potentially renewable once, giving a total award tenure of no more than 8 years. After two awards, an NIHR Senior Investigator will be awarded NIHR Emeritus Senior Investigator status if continuing in substantive employment.

The NIHR GOSH Biomedical Centre (BRC) Research Gene, Stem and Cellular Therapies (GSCT) theme has just launched a funding call for new one-year pump prime projects, which seek to drive proof of concept ideas that could potentially grow into larger research projects. Project must involve translational research and aim to develop or support the delivery of new gene and cell therapies for the NHS. NIHR funding cannot be used to support any research using animals and all funds will need to be fully spent at GOSH/ICH by 30th November 2022. ## CROHN'S SCOLITIS FOUNDATION Chronic Abdominal Pain in IBD Deadline: 22 July 2021 (outline)

Funding of up to \$900,000 per project over three years is available to projects focusing on clinical/biological heterogeneity among IBD patients living with chronic pain and the underlying cellular/molecular mechanisms. Academic investigators from any country worldwide are eligible to apply. Applications from a team with the relevant expertise is required, with one lead PI and at least one Co-PI. PIs and Co-PIs must be employed by an institution (public/private non-profit or government) engaged in health care and/or health related research.



**Paediatric Cancer Research** 

**Little Princess Trust Project Grants for** 

Deadline: 25 August 2021 (outline)

Funding of up to £200,000 per project The Project Grants support research into cancers affecting children, teenagers and young adults. Funded projects will improve understanding of the disease and help improve the outlook for children. Grants are available for small projects, pilot studies and larger projects with a maximum duration of 36 months. More information can be found on the website.



NIHR | Surgical MedTech Co-operative

**ASGBI Best New Surgical Innovation Award 2022** 

Deadline: 31 August 2021 In partnership with NIHR Surgical MedTech Co-operative, this award

supports prototype development, proof-of-concept work and early feasibility tests for new surgical technologies. Awardees will receive support to develop a technology-based solution which aligns with general surgery and/or colorectal, hepatobiliary (HPB) and vascular surgery (including wound care). Each proposal must be submitted by an ASGBI member and include a

designated clinical collaborator working in the NHS. A grant of £10,000 will support R&D activities for healthcare technologies or technologydependent interventions for surgical technologies over a period lasting up to twelve months.

The scheme offers up to £750,000 over 3 years, to support the development of technologies with transformative potential from the proof-ofconcept stage to being ready for the commercial market. #### **UCL Grand Challenges Small grants call** Deadline: 1 September 2021

Up to £5,000 available for research-informed, societally relevant, cross-disciplinary/cross-boundary activities. Proposals should relate to one of the six strands of the UCL Grand Challenges programme.



Deadline: 1 September 2021

The scheme develops talented medically and other clinically qualified professionals who have gained a higher research degree to lead their own research plans and establish their own research team to make the transition to independent investigator. The scheme provides support for up to five years and provides full personal salary costs, together with support for research staff, consumables expenses, travel costs and capital equipment appropriate for the research project.
