Funding Opportunities



All research funding applications **MUST** be [registered with R&D](#) at **least 15 days before the funder deadline** to get costings and approvals in time for the funders deadline.

[GOSH Biomedical Research Centre Translational Researcher Salary Call](#)

Funder deadline: 21/03/22

Funding available: around £150,000 to provide up to six months' salary or stipend to support staff or students who are undertaking experimental medicine research



Eligibility: The call purpose is to maximise outputs from existing translational research projects, retain exceptional translational researchers within GOSH/ICH and/or to facilitate early initiation of new projects where future funding has already been secured/sought. The salary or stipend support must be used between 1st April 2022 and 30th November 2022. There is no minimum time period. Applications are welcome from all staff employed within GOSH/ICH. Funder deadline: 22/04/2022

Funding available: Maximum of £15,000 also encourage pump-priming applications for smaller amounts of approximately £1-5,000.



Eligibility: The Olivia Hodson Cancer Fund invites applications for funding of projects starting after August 2022.

INTERNAL SELECTION

Funder deadline: Internal - 25/04/2022

Funding available: £40,000 for up to 4 years



Eligibility: Eligible Principal (PI) and Subsidiary (Co-I) supervisors (students do not apply for themselves). There should be a minimum of two supervisors and the funder is keen to give the opportunity for a young academic to be subsidiary supervisor. Each scholarship is funded for four years; This includes fees (UK fee status) and stipend for the first three years, and then stipend and thesis fee only for the fourth year, which is regarded as a writing-up year.

[UCL Therapeutic Acceleration Support \(TAS\) Fund – Call 9](#)

Funder deadline: 29/04/2022—5pm

Funding available: £60-75k (directly incurred costs only) for up to 12 months



Eligibility: The UCL Therapeutic Acceleration Support (TAS) Fund aims to accelerate the transition from discovery science to the early stages of therapeutic development by providing responsive and flexible funding to support preliminary translational work. The committee welcomes UCL applications from all career stages, from Early Career Researchers and applicants seeking to establish individual research careers, to established Principal Investigators. Funder deadline: 10/05/2022

Funding available: £ 73,538 (100,000 USD)

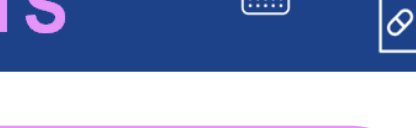


Eligibility: All proposals submitted must fall within the remit/scope of the EME Programme and further information on this can be found on the website under 'What we fund'. All primary research projects are expected to establish a programme appointed Study Steering Committee and it is important that you read the TSC/SSC Guidance before completing your application. Costs incurred by this committee should be included in the budget as appropriate

[Waterloo Foundation Child Development Grants](#)

Funder deadline: 15/05/2022

Funding available: £ 60,000



Eligibility: Funding is predominantly allocated to academic institutions, however, charities can be funded in certain circumstances. The general preference is for funds to go to a university (ie acting as the lead applicant) and for charity organisations to be co-applicants. Anyone with a PhD is eligible to apply as a Principal Investigator. Applicants can be based in any country, however, there is a preference for research that will have direct benefit to children and families in the UK. Practical support is only available for applicants in Wales.

[NIHR James Lind Alliance Priority Setting Partnerships Rolling Call \(HSDR Programme\)](#)

Funder deadline: 17/05/2022

Eligibility: The programme aims to commission high quality, well designed research which will be carried out by effective and efficient research teams, providing findings which meet the needs of NHS and Social Care managers and leaders. For more information, please visit the website.



[Royal Society Research Grants](#)

Funder deadline: 19/05/2022

Funding available: £ 20,000



Eligibility: Royal Society Research Grants support scientists in the UK who are at an early stage in their career or returning from a career break.

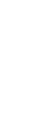
The grants are intended as 'seed corn' funding for new projects of great timeliness and promise. Projects must fall within the Royal Society's remit of all areas of the life and physical sciences, including engineering, but excluding clinical medicine. Please review the eligibility criteria on the website carefully before applying.
