EPILEPSY RESEARCH UK & YOUNG EPILEPSY FELLOWSHIP AWARD

ERUK & Young Epilepsy Fellowship Award

Deadline: 28 September 2020

Up to £300,000 over 1-4 years to cover fellow's salary, support staff and project costs. Research that aims to improve epilepsy treatment for young people by addressing the causes, prevention and clinical management of



<u>Lister Institute Research Prize Fellowships</u>

Deadline: 25 September 2020

Funding of £250,000 over 5 years for researchers in the early years of running their own independent research groups to support research costs, including equipment, travel, consumables or salaries of postdoctoral workers, technicians and PhD students. Any area of biomedical sciences research is eligible. Applicants may be scientifically trained and undertaking fulltime research, medically qualified but still undergoing some speciality training, and/or leading a research project. Personal salary is not provided.

Training Fellowships

Refinement & Reduction Deadline: 15 September 2020 **Briefing webinar: 21 July, 11:00**

Training Fellowships support early career researchers with less than 3 years' postdoctoral experience, focusing on developing new skills and gaining a breadth of research experience. Applications from any area of medical and biological research are within remit; those that integrate a range of disciplines or include an industrial partner are particularly encouraged. Applicants can apply for a commensurate salary (as agreed by the host research organisation) and up to £15k per annum for other directly incurred research costs. Awards are for a two year duration and there is one competition per year.



Rosetrees Seedcorn awards

Deadline: 31 August 2020

Up to £15k funding for 12-18 month projects to pump-prime early stage research to generate preliminary data that can be put towards future funding proposals relating to prevention, diagnosis and/or treatment of human diseases. Both pre -clinical and clinical research studies are eligible.

EME Interventions in Paediatric Care Deadline: 1 December 2020

Applications are sought for research to evaluate the efficacy of interventions in paediatric care, across both mental and physical health. All forms of health technology with the potential to improve the prevention, diagnosis, treatment or management of disease are included under this call.

Artificial Intelligence for Multiple Long-Term Conditions Deadline: 29 September 2020 Research funded through this initiative will use AI and data science methods, combined with expertise in clinical practice, applied health and care research and social science, to systematically identify or explore clusters of disease.

This call has a two-stream approach:

Research Collaboration - existing groups can apply for full Research Collaboration funding, building on their strong base of multi-disciplinary researchers and bringing on board new disciplines to meet the remit of the call, as required. Awards of £2.5-5m will be available for up to 36 months for a full Research Collaboration in wave 1. **Development Award** - applicants who are interested in applying but need more time and resources to develop a competitive proposal, may apply for a preparatory Development Award of up to £120k for 8 months before applying for Research Collaboration in Wave 2.



Sarcoma UK Genomics Research Grant

Deadline: 5 November 2020

£250,000 grant to support research into sarcoma genomics using data or samples from the 100,000 Genomes Project.

NEWS: Government published UK Research & Development Roadmap This month, the UK Government announced

its R&D Roadmap. The document is a highlevel roadmap for R&D investment, setting out BEIS' priorities and overall strategic vision for R&D ahead of the Spending Review.

The existing commitment is set to increase UK R&D investment to 2.4% GDP by 2027. A survey has been launched to gather feedback on the roadmap (closes on 12 August).
