NIHR GOSH BRC Funding

All new research applications must be registered with R&D at least 15 days before the funder deadline. R&D office is closed and all staff are working remotely or across various parts in the Trust. Please contact relevant teams by email if you require support.

Starter Grants for Clinical Lecturers

Deadline: 8 March 2021

Up to £30,000 for 1-2 years covering research costs to support Clinical Lecturers to advance their research and apply for longer-term fellowships and funding.

NIHR | National Institute for Health Research

HEE/NIHR ICA Pre-doctoral Clinical Academic Fellowship (PCAF)

Deadline: 8 March 2021

Funding to support the submission of a doctoral fellowship application. Costs cover salary for 12 months (or part-time equivalent) as well as Masters level training, conferences, and supervision costs.

Pre-doctoral Fellowship

Deadline: 25 March 2021

Funding to support individuals to start/advance a career in health and social care research methodology. Applicants should either have completed or are about to complete their undergraduate degree in a relevant subject or already hold a master's degree (or currently undertaking one) in relevant subject areas.



PRE-ANNOUNCEMENT: Nurse-led improvement projects in digital health

Grants £25,000-£50,000 for nurse-led improvement projects in digital health. Full details and eligibility information will be provided art a WEBINAR, which prospective applicants must register for and attend. Deadline to register is 5 March 2021.

The three specific areas of digital health for stage one are:

- Cohort 1 data, data analytics, digital nurse standards and patient
- Cohort 2 leadership in digital health, digital from ward to board and expanding the role of digital nurse leaders.
- Cohort 3 patient-centred digital health improvement projects.

Policy-related Small COVID-19 research grants

Deadline: 18 February 2021

Small grant (up to £15,000 for 12 months) is available for projects aimed at rapidly delivering evidence to support policy and research teams at Marie Curie exploring "Impact of COVID 19 on place of death projections across the UK".



Drinces Deadline: 17 March 2021 Grants to support research into cancers affecting children,

teenagers and young adults that will lead to kinder, more targeted, less toxic and more effective treatments and have a direct impact on the outcomes of children and young people. Grants of £15,000 to £200,000 are available for small projects, pilot studies and larger projects with a maximum duration of 36 months.



Translational Research Accelerator Grants 2021

Deadline: 14 April 2021 (outline)

A total of £1M available to fund a small number of translational projects for up to 3 years in duration.

The scheme is designed to support applications on the translational pathway with the expectation that researchers will continue to develop their therapy/ diagnostic after GOSH charity/LifeArc funding, either by securing further funding from external translational schemes (from funders such as the Medical Research Council, National Institute for Health Research, Innovate UK and others), or partnering with/licensing to industry.

Funding for research to improve health systems in LMICs up to 2 years

Deadline: 26 May 2021

in duration covering research costs at 74% FEC (UK).

Interventions to reduce antibiotic resistance or transmission

Deadline: 16 March 2021

Funding of £50k-0.5M for 3 years for projects to develop or test interventions to reduce the transmission of antibiotic resistance. You must apply as part of a transnational consortium of 3-7 partners. Your project must aim to either: understand the impact of interventions; or design, test or compare new interventions.
