How to give your child eye ointment

Instructions

- 1. Wash your hands
- 2. Get your child into any of these positions to apply the eye ointment:
 - Tilt your child's head back
 - Lay your child flat on his or her back
 - Ask someone to hold your child in a safe position
 - Wrap your baby or young child in a light blanket or sheet to keep his or her arms and legs still
- 3. Remove the top from the tube and throw away the plastic seal
- 4. Gently pull down your child's lower eyelid
- 5. Avoid touching the end of the tube against your child's eye, eyelashes or any other surface.
- 6. Apply a half-inch (1cm) strip of ointment inside the inner surface of your child's lower eyelid.
- 7. Release the lower eyelid and ask your child to close his or her eyes for a few minutes.
- 8. Put the top back on the ointment tube.
- 9. After a few minutes, ask your child to blink a few times to make sure the whole of the eye is covered by the ointment.
- 10. Wipe away any excess with a clean tissue. Eye ointment will make your child's eyes appear 'sticky', especially after sleeping. Wipe any stickiness away with a clean tissue dampened with cooled, boiled water.

Looking after the eye ointment

- Always check the expiry date of the medicine before giving it to your child.
- Keep the tube tightly closed in a cool, dark place according to the label.
- Read the instructions on the label and only use the ointment in the affected eye. If you are given a different tube for each eye, make sure you use the correct tube for each eye.
- Eye ointment should not be used more than four weeks after you first open the tube. If you are giving your child eye ointment for a certain number of days, write the date you open the tube on the label so you will know when to throw it away.
- Keep all medicines out of the reach of children.
