NON-IGE MEDIATED FOOD ALLERGY

DEFINITION

Non-IgE-mediated reactions are typically delayed in onset, and occur 4 to 72 hours after ingestion of the offending food(s).

ALARM SYMTPOMS

- Faltering growth
- Rectal bleeding
- Significant vomiting and chronic severe diarrhoea
- Family history of inflammatory bowel disease

ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA FOR REFERRAL

- Patients already on >3 food exclusions+/- anti-allergy medication and not responding
- Patients from outreach clinics:
 Luton & Dunstable, Wexham Park, Southend, Evelina, UCLH, Colchester
- Patients for 2nd opinions from other Paediatric Gastroenterologists
- Paediatric Allergists

ADVICE TO REFERRING DOCTOR BEFORE ACCEPTING PATIENT	
GPs	To refer to local Paediatrician
Paediatricians:	MEWS-free diet for 6 weeks and anti-allergy medication: if no improvement then accept referral

Paediatric	GOS Histology criteria for Eosinophilic GI disease
Gastroenterologist (2 nd opinion)	 Histology slides to be sent over with referral before acceptance
