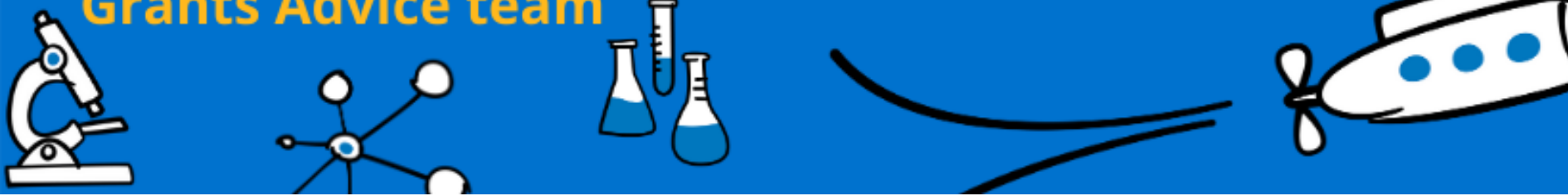

Grants of up to £125,000 over 18 months, covering salary and research costs, to support postdoctoral and early-career scientists and clinician scientists pursuing research in leukaemia, blood cancers and/or related diseases.

The Fellowships are aimed at three main categories of applicant:

- PI within two years of a first permanent appointment.
- Postdoc with no more than six years' post-PhD experience who have full PI status or are in the process of gaining PI status.
- Clinician scientists with no more than 6 years' post-PhD.

Deadline: 10 February 2021

Support for 3 year for medical and non-medical professionals which provides training in clinical and/or laboratory research techniques leading to a higher degree (usually a PhD). Applications that specifically address the charity's ambition to support every child and young person diagnosed with arthritis are encouraged. Medical graduates are expected to apply during speciality training (including surgeons/surgical trainees). Non-medical applicants must have at least one year's experience of clinical practice. Applicants should be associated with an established sponsor within a multidisciplinary research group in a UK university department, hospital or research institute.

Deadline: 8 February 2021

Grants of up to £135,000 for a maximum of three years for research into idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis.

[BLF Mesothelioma Research Network Collaborative Pump-Priming](#)

Deadline: 19 April 2021

Grants of up to £40,000 for a period of up to three years. for collaborative research into mesothelioma. PIs and all Co-applicants must be members of the BLF Mesothelioma Research Network. At least one co-applicant must be based at a different institution to the principal applicant.

Deadline: 19 April 2021

Research Grant to support research into pulmonary fibrosis with up to £40,000 available for a period of up to three years.

Funding for research into mesothelioma:

- **Clinical trial award** to support trials of new or existing molecules. Grants up to £500,000 for a maximum of four years. **Deadline: 8 February 2021**
- **Project and pump priming grants** for research into improved early diagnosis. Grants are up to £330,000 for a maximum period of three years. **Deadline: 8 February 2021**. Pump priming grants are up to £40,000 for a maximum of 18 months. **Deadline: 19 April 2021**.
