ALSF Crazy 8 Initiative Award Program

Deadline: 26 April 2021 (EOI)

Funding of \$3-5M over 4 years for collaborative crossdisciplinary research into paediatric cancer accelerating

the pace of new cure discovery. Eligible applicants are established PIs at an academic institution.

This call prioritises collaboration and resource sharing; Proposals should address one of the following paediatric cancer research themes:

- Developmental origins of paediatric cancers.
- Drugging currently undruggable paediatric cancer drivers.
- Developing novel immunotherapies.
- Discovery & development of novel cancer drug targets.

It is also expected that successful applications will address one or more of the eight disciplines at the basis of the Crazy 8 Initiative:

- Embryonal brain cancers.
- High-grade gliomas.
- Fusion-positive sarcomas.
- Fusion-negative sarcomas.
- Leukemias.
- Neuroblastoma.



MRF Emerging Leaders Prize

Foundation Deadline: 21 April 2021

Annual prize to recognise outstanding researchers in the early stages of independent research who have already had an impact in their field and have demonstrated their potential to be the research leaders of the future.

The **2021 Emerging Leaders Prize** will celebrate researchers who have made an impact in COVID-19 research.

Top prize is £100,000 and the winners can use the prize money on direct research costs, salaries of support staff, consumables and equip ment, as well as dissemination activities, travel and career develop-

The prize is open to anyone at the relevant career stage who is doing research on COVID-19 - including clinicians, lab-based scientists, allied health professionals etc. Applicants must hold a PhD, DPhil or MD and be conducting their research at an eligible institution.



The Humane Research Trust

Humane Research Trust Grants

Deadline: 30 April 2021

Funding for research to advance the diagnosis and treatment of disease in humans that involves the development of innovative alternatives to the use of animals and animal tissue.

Eligible applicants are postgraduate researchers, postdoctoral researchers and medical research fellows in the UK.

For postgraduate and postdoctoral researchers, the application must be submitted by a supervisor at the institution where the research is to take place. For medical research fellows, the application must be endorsed by the appropriate heads of department where the research

Les Rhoades Memorial PhD Studentship—this new studentship funding scheme will fund a three-year grant aimed at PhD students to undertake research into human health that does not involve the use of animals.



CHF Independent Research Awards

Deadline: 15 April (EOI)

Funding of \$100,000 pa for up to 2 years for research in clinical cardiology, including surgical and interventional techniques, as well as translational research and population science that advances the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of CHDs. Focus areas for

- Genetics
- Maternal environment and modifiable disease impact on foetuses with CHD
- Foetal diagnosis and intervention

CHD research include but are not limited to:

- Pharmacology
- Devices and procedural research
- Neurodevelopmental and functional outcomes
- Life-long care of adults with CHDs
- Technological development and advancements
- Quality improvement
- Policy regarding delivery of care, coverage, and access.

Early Career Grant for Psychologists Investigating Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED)

Deadline: 15 April 2021

Funding of \$22,000 for early career psychologists (no more than 10 years post-PhD) for research in the area of early intervention and treatment for serious emotional disturbance in children. Funder have not clarified whether applications outside of the US are accepted.



Deadline: 16 April 2021

Awards of \$25,000 for 1 year to cover research supplies and reagents.

NIHR | National Institute for Health Research

HEE/NIHR ICA Clinical Doctoral Research Fellowship

To be announced on 8 April 2021; Closes ~ early June 2021

Personal awards for health and social care professionals (excluding doctors or dentists) who are registered with an ICA eligible regulatory body to undertake a PhD-level research. The fellowship funds:

- PhD tuition fees
- salary
- the costs of a research project
- tailored training programmes (academic and professional)

Applicants are required to propose a practice host and an academic host, and a contract of employment with one of these for the hours and duration of the fellowship.
