## Long COVID in non-hospitalised individuals research call 2021

Deadline: 5 May (EOI), 12 May (final)

Funding for research that will help and support non-hospitalised adults and children with Long COVID.

Research proposals are invited on four topics:

- Therapies and Interventions
- Management and Evaluation of Services
- Other topics to help and support individuals with Long COVID Research proposals should be designed to deliver rapid tangible outcomes. Projects can be up to 24 months in duration.

**EME Mechanisms of action of interventions for COVID-19** 

Deadline 1: 22 April 2021 Deadline 2: 10 August 2021

The EME programme invites applications to investigate the underlying mechanisms of action of health and social care interventions for COVID-19.

Studies must utilise patients or samples from identifiable cohorts from current or completed NIHR-funded projects from the following programmes: i4i, EME, HS&DR, HTA, PHR, RfPB and PGfAR or equivalent funding from the Devolved Administrations.

The remit is expanded to also include mechanistic studies using patients and samples collected from eligible non-NIHR funded projects, for which all relevant recruitment must have been completed.

## **Call for PhD Project Outlines**

Annual call for PhD project outlines for inclusion in the annual GOS ICH portfolios.

Key eligibility criteria for project submission to facilitate more PhD supervision (at primary or secondary level, as appropriate) for non-Professorial staff, are as follows:

- Eligible projects will require at least one supervisor who is at Grade 7/8 (as primary or secondary supervisor) (except for the ICH/University of Toronto project portfolio)
- Supervisors who already have a CHR PhD student will not be eligible to submit a project for two years after that student registered (previously one year)
