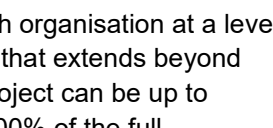
Funding Opportunities

All research funding applications **MUST** be [registered with R&D](#) at least **15 days before the funder deadline** to get costings and approvals in time for the funders deadline.

[Action Medical Research Project Grant](#)

Funder deadline: 22/03/2022

Funding available: £ 200,000. max for joint funding with Borne is £250,000.



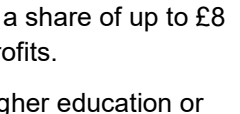
Duration of funding: 12 - 36 months

Eligibility: This will be an open competition round across our full remit. As part of this round, there will also be opportunities for potential [joint awards with Borne](#). Can only apply for one grant per round.

[Establish a 1.2 GHz nuclear magnetic resonance research facility](#)

Funder deadline: 17/03/2022

Funding available: Total fund £17,000,000



Eligibility: must be based in an organisation eligible for UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) funding. Must be a UK resident and meet one of the following criteria: be employed at the submitting research organisation at a level equivalent to lecturer or above or hold a fixed-term contract that extends beyond the duration of the project. The full economic cost of your project can be up to £17,000,000. EPSRC, BBSRC, MRC and NERC will fund 100% of the full economic cost.

[Knowledge transfer partnerships: 2022 to 2023, round one](#)

Funder deadline: 06/04/2022

Funding available: apply for a share of up to £8 million



Eligibility: UK registered academic institutions, research and technology organisations (RTO) or catapults can apply for a share of up to £8 million to fund innovation projects with businesses or not-for-profits.

To lead a project your organisation must be a UK registered higher education or further education institution, RTO or catapult collaborate with a UK registered business or a not-for-profit organisation, both must have two or more employees. The business must contribute to the project's costs.

Horizon Europe, the EU's research & innovation funding programme for 2021-2027, has calls for Collaborative proposals in Health topics with a single-stage deadlines in April 2022.

Funding available: \$ 50,000



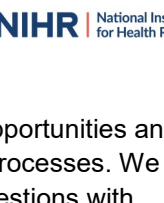
Duration of funding: 12 months

Eligibility: Eligible applicants must have a PhD, MD, or equivalent degree and must currently hold a full-time position at any level (post-doctoral, research scientist, assistant/associate/full professor, etc.) at an established academic/ research institution. Applicants will be considered from both the United States and internationally. Investigators from centres with a history of research in metabolic diseases are strongly encouraged to apply.

[Crohn's & Colitis Foundation Senior Research Awards](#)

Funder deadline: 05/05/22

Funding available: £ 259,821 (348,000 USD)



Eligibility: Applicants must hold an MD and/or PhD (or equivalent degree) and must be employed by an institution (public non-profit, private non-profit or government) that is engaged in healthcare and/or health-related research. Additionally, the applicant must have attained independence from their mentor.

Eligibility is not restricted by citizenship or geography. Only one application is allowed per applicant per submission date.
