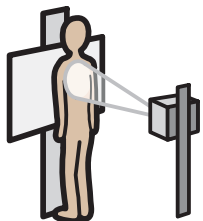


Having a contrast scan

You are coming to hospital for a contrast scan.
A contrast scan makes a picture of inside your body.
This helps the doctors work out how to look after you.



Your parents can come into the room with you.
They will need to wear a special apron.



You may need to wear special hospital clothes.



We will give you a liquid to drink.
This travels down your throat into your tummy.
This liquid shows up well on x-rays.



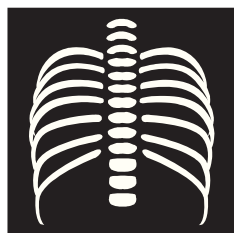
We need you to stay very still while we take some pictures.



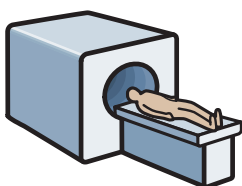
We may ask you to lie down when you have had the drink.
