Please note, due to challenges around home-working and staffing, ICH Finance Team will now require 7 working days to produce costings for any research. To ensure that an application for COVID-19 research is prioritised, please put COVID-19 and the deadline into all relevant email subject communications.

In light of current situation, research into COVID-19 is a priority and therefore many funders have announced changes to their deadlines, provided new guidelines to current grant holders, and announced new funding calls and priority areas. Below are highlights relevant to GOSH and ICH researchers.

#### Virtual workshop on mouse genetics

#### Wednesday 20 May 2020

The virtual meeting will bring together scientists from the mouse and human disease genetics research communities to discuss:

Translating Research into Policy (TRiP)

Deadline: 19 May 2020

Funding for existing NIHR investigators for small-scale projects between £50k-£150k lasting between 6-12 months, with clear policy relevance and building on existing NIHR funded work.

NIHR Fellowship Programme is now open: For both Doctoral and Advanced fellowships this is the firsts time NIHR is offering industry partnership with Pfizer for Round 4.

**Doctoral Fellowship** 

Deadline: 13 August 2020

Three year full-time award that supports individuals to undertake a PhD in an area of NIHR research.

Part funding through charity and industry partnerships available with focus on partner research priorities. Round 4 partners are: Chartered Society of Physiotherapy Charitable Trust, Kidney Research UK, Moorfields Eye Charity, Wellbeing Women and Pfizer (research in the area of chronic pain).

Advanced Fellowship

Deadline: 29 July 2020

Postdoctoral fellowship intended for researchers at any career stage before chair award.

Round 4 partnership awards are available from Castang Founda-

tion, Moorfields Eye Charity, The Dunhill Medical Trust and Pfizer (research in atopic dermatitis or alopecia areata).



#### Government announces support for PhD students as a result of coronavirus disruption

UKRI-funded PhD students whose studies have been disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic will be provided with additional support. Students in their final year will receive an extension to their research with additional grants, known as a costed extension, of up to six months providing them with peace of mind that they will be able to complete their studies.

Short term (up to 12 month) proposals that could make a significant contribution to the understanding, prevention and/or management of the COVID-19 outbreak.



Professorship Scheme Deadline: 21 May 2020

Support to researchers in the field of biomedical sciences or healthcare imminently taking up their first full Professorship. Funding for up to five years and for a maximum of £500K to be used to fund research assistance, research costs or equipment.

Apply to switch your existing funding to Covid-19 priority areas

To be eligible, the research to be undertaken must address one of the following:

- new research with a clear impact pathway that has the potential to deliver a significant contribution to the understanding of, and response to, the COVID-19 pandemic and its impacts.
- supports the manufacture and/or wide scale adoption of an intervention with significant potential
- gathers critical data and resources quickly for future research use.

Please note that no subsequent extension to the grant or additional costs will be allowed to meet the original objectives where these were altered to permit new COVID-19 research.

Funding for cross-institutional teams to produce tools, platforms and resources
