


### whats outside the window?




#### Windows




**Choral Forest**





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
#### Did you know?

maybe even a goat!




**Bloomsbury Map** by Alan Kitching. Kangaroo Ward, Premier Inn Clinical Building


Stanfords map shop in Covent Garden is the largest map shop in London, it's been selling maps for 150 years and it's even been mentioned in a Sherlock Holmes book!



## create your own country – make a flag


