Having your photo taken (Easy Read)



Photos are part of your medical record. They can show how you look before and after treatment. Sometimes they show how you change as you grow older.



We have a team of photographers (said: fo-tog-graf-ers). They take lots of photos each year of children and young people.



The photos we take will be put into your medical record. We may also ask you if you agree to us using your photo in a poster, leaflet or on our website.



We usually take photos in our studio. This has lots of bright lights so we can take a good photo.



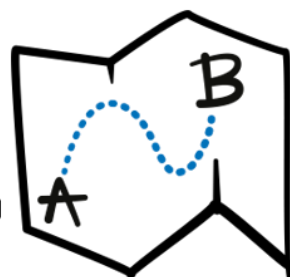
Your parents can come into the studio with you. You can ask for a male or female photographer.



You may have to undress. This depends on the part of your body we are photographing.



We may ask you to sit down.





We may ask you to stand.



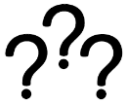
We may ask you to open your mouth if we are taking pictures of your teeth or tongue.

When they have finished, they will put the photos on our computer system so your doctor can see them.
