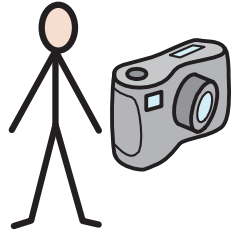


Having your photo taken

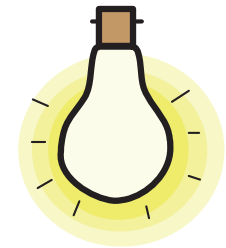
Photos are part of your medical record.
They can show how you look before and after treatment.
Sometimes they show how you change as you grow older.



We have a team of photographers at the hospital.
They take lots of photos each year of children and young people.



Before we take your photo,
we want you and your parents or carers to agree.
You can also tell us if you just want the photo in your medical notes.
You can also agree to let us use your photo in our booklets.



We usually take photos in our studio.
This has lots of bright lights so we can take a good photo.



Your parent or carer can come into the studio with you.
You can ask for a male or female photographer.

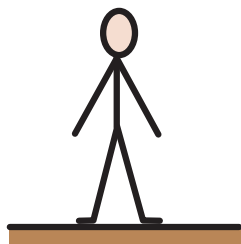


You may have to undress.

Having your photo taken



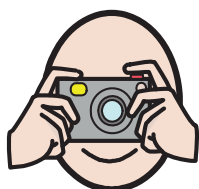
We may ask you to sit down.



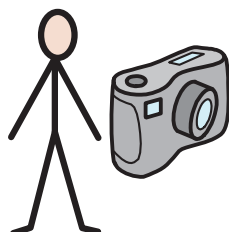
We may ask you to stand.
