Thank you for your request for information, which we have processed under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Please see our response to your following request for information:

Your Request

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request the following:

- 1) The number of working days lost to stress, anxiety, depression and other mental health conditions by members of staff within the your trust, by year since 2009.
- 2) The cost of losing these working days (based on wage multiplied by working hours lost).

Our Response

Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children NHS Foundation Trust (the 'Trust') is a single site, specialist tertiary paediatric trust. Please see our response in the following table, including the note* below the table:

<u>Please note</u>: * the information provided in the above table shows the days lost are reported as FTE Days Lost, which is how absences are reported by the Trust. All conditions are grouped together on the ESR and cannot categorise lost days in the format of each condition you specified

We should also emphasise the data shows very low days lost in the earlier years, especially 2009. Accuracy of reporting has improved over the years, which means absences in this category will more likely to have been reported as 'Unknown' (days lost to unknown were much higher in 2009 than in 2019). The records show the workforce is 50% larger in October 2019 than it was at the start of 2009.
