Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children NHS Foundation Trust is withholding this information under Section 40 of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000 in order to reduce the risk of identifying an individual(s). The Trust is of the view that in providing this information it would significantly increase the risk of an individual(s) being identified. The Trust believes that Section 40(2) of the FOIA is applicable in withholding the information where disclosure could lead to third party individuals being identified and this could be considered to be a breach of their rights under the Data Protection Act (DPA) 2018. The Trust also has a duty of confidentiality and holds the view that Section 41(1) of the FOIA, where information has been provided in confidence, is applicable for the reasons that the information was obtained by the Trust, which has the required quality of confidence (being neither generally accessible nor trivial) and disclosure of this information to the public would give rise to an actionable breach of confidence under Section 41(1) of the FOIA. A breach of the expectation of confidentiality

would have the effect of the information being processed unfairly in respect of the personal data and confidentiality relating to third party information. Your request is therefore exempt under both Section 40(2) and Section 41(1) of the FOIA.
