Thank you for your request for information processed under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Please see our response to your following request for information:

Your Request and Our Response (in Bold)

I should like to request the following information under the Freedom of Information Act. My request concerns ECMO (VV and VA) in the intensive care/critical care areas of the hospitals within your Trust.

Questions:

1. How many patients were treated with ECMO in 2019 (please indicate number of VV and number of VA)?

VV - <5 **

VV-VA - <5**

VA - **20**

Total: 25

Please note: **Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children NHS Foundation Trust (the 'Trust') is unable to respond to information where there have been fewer than five data subjects (<5**) covering the time period you have specified. The Trust is withholding this information under Section 40 (Personal Information) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000 in order to reduce the risk of identifying third party individuals.

The Trust believes providing this information would significantly increase the risk of third party individuals being identified. The Trust believes that Section 40(2) of the FOIA is therefore applicable for withholding the information where the disclosure of personal data could contravene their rights under the Data Protection Act DPA) 2018.

The Trust also has a duty of confidentiality and holds the view that Section 41(1) of the FOIA, where information has been provided in confidence, is applicable for the reasons that the information which was obtained by the Trust, has the necessary quality of confidence (being neither generally accessible nor trivial) and disclosure of this information to the public would give rise to an actionable breach of confidence under Section 41(1) of the FOIA. A breach of this expectation of



confidentiality would have the effect of the information being processed unfairly regarding the personal data and confidentiality relating to third party information. Your request is therefore exempt under Section 40(2) and Section 41(1) of the FOIA.

- 2. What was the average length of ECMO therapy in 2019 (please indicate number of days for VV and VA)?
 - VV 10 Days
 - VV-VA 3 Days
 - VA 6.4 Days (only ECMO bed-days, assessment, post ECMO is not included)
- 3. How many ECMO machines are available for use on the ICU/critical care areas of the hospital? 5 stacks each with a backup machine
 1 stand-alone machine
- 4. Who is/are your supplier(s) of ECMO machines and consumables? **Chalice Medical** and **Getinge**
- 5. How old are the ECMO machines? **Chalice Medical 2 years Getinge approx. 4 years**
- 6. Are the machines covered by a maintenance agreement with the manufacturer? Yes
- 7. What was the total spend on all associated consumables for ECMO in 2019? £365,954
- 8. What is the earliest date a change of provider may be considered? 2027
- 9. Which department is responsible for the ECMO budget (machines and consumables) **ECMO. Heart/lung.**
